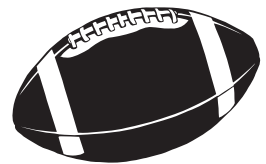

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HOSPITAL HAPPENINGS

A report from your Twin Cities BOG representative

Dear Fellow Nobles and Ladies,

I wanted to share with you the recent renovations and updates at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Twin Cities. March 11, 2016 was a big day at your hospital. Major repairs and construction was completed on two different projects that returned critical spaces back to service.

The hospital's dish room had been inoperable since December 18 following water damage. New tile and reassembly of the dish machine is complete so that steel forks and spoons are back replacing plastic utensils and paper plates. The food is always good, but it's even better on flatware. We will probably miss that "picnic" feeling every day.

Also on the same day, the full outpatient clinic was restored to service following a complete renovation. Over 5,000 square feet of exam rooms and related work area was improved. The new space is highlighted by bright, vibrant colors – orange, greens, deep purple – with matching carpet, new lighting and furniture, a second cast room and wheelchair accessible washroom. Doors were widened throughout the space to enable easier wheelchair access. In response to staff requests, an expanded exam room was created to accommodate telehealth equipment and space for expanded family consultation. All of these changes advance the spirit of health and life for our patients and their families.

During the March BOG meeting we invited our temple hospital representatives to attend. Erin Jurkovich, Sophia Jones, Jennifer Sutch and Lauren Elm hosted a meeting of representatives from across the shrine temples to learn more about the hospital and ways that they can help in donor development, referral development and community relations. Our every own Gayle Angus was highlighted during the meeting for his hard work in making the Sesostris/Samani Screen Clinic such a success! Through this first time event, along with the positive outcomes and feedback from those representatives who attended, we are

exploring ways to have these meetings on a regular basis.

While we can get caught up in the mundane "business" activities and even the politics within Shriners Hospitals for Children (which I have to admit I am guilty of from time to time), I wanted to end my article with some comments from our patients and their families after visiting your Twin-Cities hospital. At the end of day – It's really what matters!

"He (physician) explained everything that would happen in great detail."

"Every staff person talked to my son, so that he knew what was going on during the visit, and they made sure we both understood each step of our visit."

"Shriners really cares about my son, and makes sure that the whole child and whole family is cared for. My son loved the physical therapists and the physical therapy area."

"The care and concern for my daughter's comfort was outstanding!"

"Everything is great! Keep up the good work! Thank you."
