During the 162nd Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Kansas held last month, the Kansas Masonic Foundation Inc., the charitable arm for the Grand Lodge of Kansas and Kansas Masons, announced a pledge of \$500,000 over the next 10 years to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

This announcement follows the donation of \$25,000 a year over the past three years that was presented annually during the statewide East-West Shrine Bowl event. Kansas Masons are committed to continuing this important charitable investment through the Kansas Masonic Foundation.

The check was presented to Jeffrey L. Sowder, Imperial Assistant Rabban of Shriners International and Past Grand Master of Kansas, and Bradley T. Koehn, Imperial Treasurer of Shriners International, by B. Cole Presley, Grand Master of Masons in Kansas, Michael J. Tavares, Outgoing President of the Kansas Masonic Foundation, and Frederick W. Reichert, Past Grand Master and President of the Kansas Masonic Foundation.

March Madness 2018 Wheelchair State Championship



On March 9-10, Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago gave their support to the 2018 Illinois High School Association (IHSA) Wheelchair Tournament, which was a special opportunity to recognize Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children.

March Madness is held each year in Peoria, Illinois, and the IHSA Class 1 and 2-A includes the IHSA Wheelchair Basketball State Championship.

For the past four years, Gary McDaniels, Jerry McDaniels and John Hartwig, all Past Potentates of Mohammed Shriners in Bartonville, Illinois, have been Center Court Volunteers for the IHSA Wheelchair Tournament. "Since the event is held in Peoria, we as Past Potentates saw an opportunity to get involved," said Hartwig. "This is the 16th year of this event."

This year, the Wheelchair Basketball Championship event had four teams participating: the Chicago Skyhawks, Peoria Wildcats, Rockford Chariots and LWSRA Hawks. Games were played on Friday and Saturday. The Peoria Wildcats, coached by Mike Van Cleve, won the 2018 State Wheelchair Basketball Championship, playing the Chicago Skyhawks. On the Peoria team is player Chauncey Wulf, #55, a Shriners Hospitals patient and senior player, which made this a special win for the Peoria Wildcats. Other teams also have players who are patients of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Representatives Evening Concert

The Imperial Representatives Evening Concert, featuring the Oak Ridge Boys, will take place in the Ocean Center Arena on Wednesday, July 18.

The concert kicks off at 7 p.m. Tickets are available at the Ocean Center box office until the day of the event, and are \$25 each for general admission. You can also pre-order your tickets online by visiting imperial2018.com/events/concert.

The Oak Ridge Boys

The original Oak Ridge Boys, a piece of history, have one of the most distinctive and recognizable sounds in the music industry. The four-part harmonies and upbeat songs of the Oak Ridge Boys have spawned dozens of county hits and a number one pop smash, earned them Grammy, Dove, CMA and ACM awards and garnered a host of other industry and fan accolades. Every

time they step before an audience, the Oaks bring four decades of charted singles and 50 years of tradition to the stage show, which is widely acknowledged as among the most exciting anywhere. The Oaks has scored 12 gold, three platinum, and one double platinum album – plus one double platinum single – and more than a dozen national number one singles and more than 30 top 10 hits.

Their string of hits includes the country-pop chart-topper *Elvira*, as well as *Bobbie Sue*, *Dream On*, *Thank God For Kids*, *American Made*, *I Guess It Never Hurts to Hurt Sometimes*, *Fancy Free*, *Gonna Take A Lot Of River* and many others.

The Oaks went through numerous lineup changes in its early decades before Duane Allen, Joe Bonsall, William Lee Golden, and Richard Sterban took control in the 1960s and early 1970s and turned the band into a dynamic country music force. The alignment focused on high-energy vocal harmonies that brought



crowds to their feet with increasingly secular music and a look and attitude that more accurately reflected the times, characterized by Golden's still-magnificent flowing beard and fur coats.
