




HOSPITAL HAPPENINGS

A report from your Twin Cities BOG representative

Dear Fellow Nobles and Ladies,

The weekend of May 20-22 was an outstanding one for Shriners Hospitals – Twin Cities. This year brought a new event to the mix; one that will hopefully continue into the future.

Illustrious Sir Keith Plummer, his wife Arlis, III. Sir Jack Lorenzen and Joan Sinkule joined Laura and I at the inaugural Gala fundraiser on Friday night. We had the honor of spending the evening with the family of Sofia Tate, who was our local Rainbow of Hope winner. The evening included many silent auction items, prizes, and several unique live auction items. The evening was emceed by two local TV anchors, both of whom have personal connections to the hospital.

Initially, organizers hoped they might have 200 or so attendees and raise \$100,000. In addition to our small contingent from Sesostris-land, there were Shriners from other temples, special guests, and members of the public. When all was said and done, more than 400 people attended. Money raised also exceeded expectations surpassing \$180,000, all for the benefit of our Minneapolis hospital.

Since Shriners and their ladies already attend so many dinners and balls, some folks may wonder about the purpose of this one. Ultimately, the idea is to make this a public event, attended by members of the Minneapolis-St. Paul communities, who are interested in supporting the Twin Cities hospital in a significant way. We already know that Shriners support our hospitals. This is a way to bring other people into the fold of our Shrine family. Whether it will continue to be held during this same weekend, we'll have to wait and see. The hospital staff stepped up in a big way, prepping and working at the Gala and then staffing Hospital Day on Saturday. They were pretty pooped by the end of the two days!

Speaking of Saturday, that was another significant success. When we used to hold Hospital Day on a Friday, attendance was spotty. Moving it to Saturday has more than doubled attendance. It's obvious that the Twin Cities hospital has stepped up their activities, to meet the interest

of those who come. They hosted craft tables, had horse rides for children, created a stocked swimming pool so kids could go fishing, gave presentations on the various camps and programs hosted by the hospital, and gave tours of many areas of the hospital – some of which are not always accessible on normal days.

I've included pictures of many of the activities, which can be found on page 3, with the hope that you (nobles and ladies) will consider making Hospital Day a "go-to" event, and see the meaning behind the fundraisers that we do locally. When you see kids running around on prosthetic legs, or giving the doctors and nurses a hug, or you look at the colorful hallway of the new clinic area, you see what kind of time and care is devoted to transforming the lives of our patients and their families.

One of the most anticipated additions to the hospital is still to come. Money raised from the Gala as well through donations and other fundraisers will help pay for the new cutting edge EOS machine. You've probably heard me mention, the machine uses much lower radiation and produces highly detailed images. Every Shrine hospital will eventually receive one, but they are not cheap. The machine alone runs \$500,000. Plus, there are costs associated with updating the room and space where the machine is located within the hospital. All told, we are looking to raise \$750,000.

Some Shrine centers have taken on fundraising for this project as a club or unit activity. It may be one that you will want to consider within your club or unit here in Sesostris. If so, I'd be glad to give you more information.

Sofia Tate of Columbus, NE

Sesostris Shrine is proud to announce that Sofia Tate of Columbus, NE was one of three recipients of the Rainbow of Hope award from Shriners Hospitals for Children -- Twin Cities. This award is given to current or former patients of the hospital who have made significant contributions to their communities or schools and for overcoming life's challenges.

Tate received her award at Hospital Day. She received a cash prize and had her name placed on the plaque in the hospital's main lobby.

Sofia was born in Bulgaria and adopted by her parents, Jill and Rick Tate when she was 18 months old. She was born without her right leg. Shortly after adoption, she became a patient of Shriners Hospitals.

By the time she was five year's old, Tate had started taking dance classes. In high school, she was on the swim team and cheerleading squad. Tate currently attends Wesleyan University in Lincoln, where she is on the cheer squad.

Tate is also a recipient of the Ron Gustafson Inspiration Award, presented by the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame.





The Importance of Positive Communication to Children with Disabilities

The Power of Language

Our word choices have a tremendous impact on those around us. Children, especially, are deeply influenced by the language surrounding them – who they become is based on who they are learning to be. The staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children® understands the importance of building confidence and self-esteem in our patients at an early age. Our staff recognizes that while working with children with disabilities, it is imperative to help them develop a strong positive attitude so they will have the confidence to pursue their dreams. To accomplish this, being mindful of the effect language has on children is critical.

Two essential points in using communication as affirmation are accurate wording and people-first language. Always remember to use language that encourages, rather than discourages, the individual. When referring to those with a disability, please remember to **avoid labels with a negative connotation**, such as:

- crippled
- handicapped
- lame
- deformed

» **The preferred word choice is usually:**

- disability
- disabled
- the actual term involved, such as, cerebral palsy or muscular dystrophy

People with Disabilities are People First

The second key element of communicating with people with disabilities is the need to use “people-first language,” where the person is the important element, rather than the disability.

For example, try using phrases such as “a person *with* cerebral palsy” or “a person *who uses* a prosthetic arm,” rather than defining them by the disability itself.

It is also important to recognize that people are individuals, and to **avoid lumping those with disabilities together into one group**, like “the disabled,” “the spinal cord injured,” or to refer to “all people with X.”

» Another important aspect of using people-first language is to **avoid negative descriptive phrases and terms**, such as:

- confined to a wheelchair
- wheelchair bound
- victim stricken with
- suffering

Instead, try saying a person “uses a wheelchair,” or “has cerebral palsy.”



“We must take language very seriously. The feeling I have is that language is always a reflection of attitude. With the advancement of the disability movement, you see a change in language.” – Michael Masutha

Also avoid **value-laden words and phrases**, whether negative or positive, because even seemingly positive labels such as “courageous” and “inspirational” can be burdensome to a child, setting unnecessary high expectations, that may be hard to maintain.

As part of using people-first language, it is also imperative to not define people by their disabilities. This is accomplished by **emphasizing abilities, not limitations**.

» For instance:

- Say: “Darlene is an excellent writer,” rather than, “Despite her disability, Darlene is an excellent writer.”
- Say, “Johnny is a child with a disability,” instead of the defining, “Johnny is a *disabled child*.”

Being mindful of preferred disability terminology and using people-first language whenever possible will help children with disabilities become more confident and able to become successful, productive adults.




