
















Give to Lincoln Day

For the first time ever, Sesostris Shrine participated in the the Give to Lincoln Day. Give to Lincoln Day is a 24-hour event that encourages people to contribute to Lincoln and Lancaster County nonprofit organizations. Give to Lincoln Day is co-ordinated by the Lincoln Community Foundation, in partnership with local nonprofit organizations. People can actually donate all month long, but the big day of giving was May 30. As an added incentive, there are matching funds available which are added to donations. This year, \$450,000 dollars were available in matching funds. When was all said and done, the match ratio was roughly 10 percent (9.5%).


Four-hundred and thirty-nine non-profit organizations participated in this year's Give to Lincoln Day and over \$5.5 million dollars was raised to benefit the works of these non-profit organizations. Through the hard work of Ill. Sir Richard Eggerling, Ill. Sir Drew Borske P.P., Noble Jeff Eggerling, and the Sesostris Office staff, Sesostris was able to get the Sesostris Shrine Hospital Transportation Fund registered for the Give to Lincoln event. Both a webpage and marketing materials were created to promote our Transportation Fund. For the first time out of the gate and with a large learning curve on how the event works, Sesostris should be very proud of the results obtained. The Sesostris Shrine Hospital Transportation Fund received \$532.00 in check/ cash donations, plus \$600.00 through the online website credit card portal, and \$107.42 in matching funds, for a grand total of \$1,239.42.

Thank you to everyone who donated and worked on this new, exciting program which helps promote what Sesostris Shrine does for children in our community!

Parade Participation:

In all Sesostris Civic Parades, full support or otherwise, Nobles, their ladies and children and Masonic-related organizations may participate with the approval of the Potentate. Only Nobles may perform, compete, ride vehicles with fewer than four wheels, or operate any vehicle while parading. An approval form has been created to allow Sesostris ladies to ride in any four-wheel vehicle. This form will also allow ladies and children to walk the parade route and hand out candy, approved literature, etc. on a Club/Unit basis. This form must be filled out to participate and is available at the Shrine Office.

Note: The Shrine Bowl Parade (Kearney) & the Fairbury Parade (Fairbury) are Shrine parades and only shrine Nobles are allowed to parade in Shrine parades.

This year, each parade will "feature" a particular Sesostris unit. This unit will parade behind the Divan in the lineup.




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Shriners and ladies are invited to join the Cruis'n Classics every fourth Wednesday of the month at Don & Millie's at 56th & Hwy 2.



This tool is called a "micrometer". It is a very accurate measuring device measuring to .0001 "one ten thousands" of an inch. — That's taking a human hair, which measures approximately .003 of an inch in Ø, and splitting that hair Ø 30 times.


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CHANGE IS GOOD

Many of you over the years have come to know that I have two sayings that I use often. The first one is if you always do what you've always done, you will always get what you have always got. Meaning, change should be a good thing. To many people, however, change is a four-letter word.

In this edition of the FEZtivities, you will find the announcement that the Board of Governors for Twin Cities has completed and signed a deal to move the current hospital to a new location. This has been in the works for some time now and I'm happy to report that we are moving to the next phase which is designing and building what our new place will look like. I can tell you that it will be smaller, but the offerings will not change, other than on-sight surgeries. Those will continue to be done at Gillette and other locations as determined by the patient's needs.

I had the opportunity to attend a conference of the Boards of four of our other hospitals (Lexington, Chicago, St. Louis and Twin Cities) in Chicago just before Memorial Day weekend. At this meeting, we had an intense discussion regarding the future of our Shrine healthcare system and how we need to change our current business model. We looked at lots of numbers including the number of inpatient surgeries, outpatient surgeries, clinic visits and of course, all the financial costs associated with everything we do.

You have heard me mention at our Stated Meetings that when Twin Cities opened, our average inpatient stay was 104 days. When we made the decision to change our business model to that of a clinic, our average stay was less than a half day. Financially, it was the prudent change to make. It was a hard change to make for the Nobility, especially for the Nobles in the Twin Cities. I was reminded that when I was appointed to the Divan in 2003, there was legislation proposed at that time to address the decline in inpatient activity then. Now in 2019, we're making the needed changes.

At the conference in Chicago, we looked at the overall hospital system and I'm sure that you will not be surprised to learn that Twin Cities is not unique to declining numbers. It is system wide. While this may sound alarming, it is quite exciting and heartwarming. Exciting because this shows that we have grown in our ability and skills to take care

of children better and more quickly. Heartwarming because we still have a dramatic impact on the lives of the kids we care for.

The challenge that we (Shriners Hospital for Children) are faced with now, is how do we best continue to grow in the care that we give? In the US, we have 20 hospitals (monuments) that are being under-utilized and are expensive to maintain and operate (no pun intended). We need to look at other business models that will allow us to continue providing care to our children for generations to come.

Much like the Twin Cities system becoming a clinic, Lexington has moved and is now an Ambulatory Surgical Center with no overnight stays. Other models might be to continue as a hospital or to join another local hospital and share space with them like the Cincinnati Hospital has recently done. It is time for change.

Focusing on the Twin Cities now, I am excited to mention that we are currently in negotiations with a children's hospital in Des Moines that wants us to become part of the services that they can offer within their community. We are currently offering POPs clinics at Boys Town in Omaha and will soon be offering off-premise clinics there, too. We're looking for a similar partnership or collaboration in the Dakotas. We want to be able to reach out to more kids in more locations. Can you imagine Sesostris patients going to Omaha for a clinic checkup instead of driving to Minneapolis? Ask a Road Runner how long the trip is to Minneapolis, not to mention the travel expenses associated with it.

Even though we are changing to a clinic model, there is still plenty of need for support from the Nobility. We will still need Road Runners, Clowns and other volunteers to help. We will still need donors to help fund new things for the clinics and we will still offer the camps and other activities for the kids. For the first time, there will be a local camp in July so our kids and their families don't have to take time off from work to make the trip to Minneapolis for a camp.

We officially have a new home! After a great deal of planning and searching, we will be moving to a new building in the City Place Development in Woodbury, Minnesota, an eastern suburb of St. Paul, Minnesota, by the summer of 2020. This move is a step in our transition to an outpatient clinic model. Construction of our new site will begin later this summer and continue into the middle of next year. The current site will be sold as the transition to the new site is completed.

Ease of highway access, proximity to other local area amenities, first floor access and the opportunity to design and build out space incorporating the knowledge gained from 96 years of service, were all elements that influenced the selection of the site and the timing of this transition. Developing a new site is a special opportunity to create a patient-centered environment for the modern era. The new site will continue to serve children from a seven-state service area.

Shriners Healthcare for Children's new facility will provide a wide range of services for children with orthopaedic conditions including:

- Clinic Services: providing a family-centered, team approach to care. Patients will see specialty physicians, nurses, therapists and other pediatric-trained specialists in an environment designed for children.
- Child Life: providing families with support during appointments through play and anxiety coping activities. The Child Life program also offers over twenty (20) camps and programs to meet the physical and emotional needs of children with orthopaedic conditions.
- Radiology: providing standard x-ray service as well as EOS, which provides 3-D, full-body imaging with up to 85 percent lower radiation.
- Rehabilitation: providing physical and occupational therapy to help children build skills, strength and mobility needed for everyday activities.
 - Scoliosis Specific Exercise a specialized physical therapy program that uses exercises, stretching and breathing to improve a patient's scoliotic posture.
- Orthotics and Prosthetics: offering orthotic and prosthetic services specifically for children, including upper and lower extremity prosthetic care, scoliosis bracing and a broad spectrum of pediatric orthotic services.
- Telehealth: including telehealth capabilities that enable video connection to other
 remote sites across the region, creating more opportunities for access to children in
 need of pediatric orthopaedic services. This capability enhances Shriners Hospitals for
 Children's reputation as the largest network of specialized pediatric orthopaedic and
 burn telehealth sites in the world.
- Surgery Services: All surgeries will be performed by Shriners Healthcare for Children
 — Twin Cities physicians at Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare in St. Paul,
 Minnesota, or other pediatric hospitals.



Concurrently, we continue our planning efforts to expand our presence throughout our service area. This expansion will take on a variety of forms that could include new affiliations with other healthcare organizations and individual providers, expanding the use of our telehealth technologies and establishing physical clinics, just as a few examples. We see this as an exciting opportunity that supports the Shriners Hospitals for Children's system initiative of "Reaching More Kids in More Places."






